## SUGAR BOUNTY.

## No. 4 of 1903.

An Act to provide for a Bounty to Growers of Sugar-Cane and Beet.

[Assented to 30th July, 1903]

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Sugar Bounty Act 1903.
- 2. There shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to every grower of sugar-cane or beet in the Commonwealth in the production of which white labour only has been employed after 1 February 1903, at the rates provided by this Act, on all such sugarcane or beet delivered for manufacture after the commencement of this Act and before 1907. Provided that no bounty shall be paid in respect of the production of sugar on land cultivated by other than white labour after a bounty has been paid.
- 3. The bounty [on cane] shall be at the rate of four shillings per ton ...
- 4. The bounty on beet shall be at the rate of forty shillings per ton.
- ...
- 8. The Governor-General may make Regulations.
